Date of death: 25 May 1916

Subject: Herman Aitt

Herman Aitt, fifty years old, died at 8:30 o'clock last night at the St. Joseph Hospital from what is believed to have been bichloride of mercury poisoning, presumably taken with the intention of committing suicide. He had been rooming at Sixth and Messanie streets and when he became very ill several days ago was sent to Central Police Station, where Dr. F. G. Beard, police surgeon, attended him and sent him to the hospital. He refused to say whether or not he had taken poison intentionally. He came to St. Joseph several weeks ago and before that was in Baltimore.

Mr. Fielding Allen, colored, died at 6:30 o'clock last evening at his late residence, 617 North Second street, after a brief illness from pneumonia, aged 67 years 7 months and 16 days. The time of the burial will be announced later.

The deceased was born March 18th, 1818, in Burling [sic] county, North Carolina, and came to St. Joseph in 1845, where he has since resided. He was one of the oldest settlers of St. Joseph.

One of the men, Fred Horning, a chauffeur, was capture but the man who did the shooting, ... Sutherland, a waiter, escaped.

Captain Auble was former chief of police of Los Angeles.
