

# Please Help Identify this picture

I've "rescued" an old photograph of Nettie FERGUSON of Hiawatha, Kansas which was taken at the Zimmerman Studio in Hiawatha. The photograph appears to have been taken in the early 1900's with Nettie likely in her teens or 20's at the time the photograph was taken. Based on limited research I was able to locate the following information regarding Nettie and her family:

Nettie F. FERGUSON b. about 1883 in OH, her father was L.A. FERGUSON (b. about 1858 in OH). Nettie married George Francis GIRARD (b. 10 Jan1879 in St. Joseph, MO) in Hiawatha, KS on 2 Jul 1902 and together they had three children including, Frances; George L.; and Edwin GIRARD all born between 1905 and 1912 in KS and ID.

Nettie FERGUSON, age 17, born Oct 1882, born OH, parents born OH, at School
